As part of an exchange programme, students from partner universities can take courses at the Sciences Po Undergraduate College on one of the university's seven campuses. For one or two semesters, they are fully integrated into the Sciences Po student body.

Eligibility (#)

To be eligible for the Sciences Po Undergraduate College exchange programme (FR) (Bachelor's level), students from partner universities must have completed at least four semesters of university studies and have been nominated by their home university.

Exchange students can take courses in English or French, depending on their home university's requirements. They study at the Undergraduate College alongside all the other Sciences Po students, so are fully integrated into the Sciences Po student body even if they choose a curriculum taught entirely in English.

Please note: exchange students are asked to explain in their cover letter to Sciences Po why they want to study on the campus for which they were nominated by their home university. As such, they need to have the level of language proficiency required for that campus.

# Language tests for exchange students

### Language requirements

Language requirements vary between programmes.

### Accepted language tests

#### French:

For programmes that require a C1 level of French, the following tests are accepted:

- TCF 500
- · DELF/DALF C1

For programmes that require a B2 level of French, the following tests are accepted:

- TCF 400
- DELF B2

### English:

For programmes that require a C1 level of English, the following tests are accepted:

- IELTS 6.5
- TOEFL 100
- · Cambridge Certificate in Advanced English (CAE) level C1
- Cambridge Certificate of Proficiency in English (CPE)

For programmes that require a B2 level of English, the following tests are accepted:

- IELTS 6
- TOEFL 87
- · Cambridge English First
- Cambridge Certificate in Advanced English (CAE) level C1
- · Cambridge Certificate of Proficiency in English (CPE)

### Language test exemptions

The following students do not need to submit English language test results:

- · Students whose native language is English and who want to study at Sciences Po
- Students whose language of instruction at their home university is English and who want to study at Sciences Po in English.
- · Students from the following countries in Northern Europe where English is the language. used in higher education (75% minimum): Denmark, Sweden, Norway, Finland, Iceland and the Netherlands.
- · Students who have a school leaving qualification from an English-language secondary school system (e.g. A-Levels or High School Diploma).
- · Students who have a higher education diploma from a university where the language of instruction is English.
- Students with an International Baccalaureate (IB) who chose English as their language of instruction (level A1 / A2).
- · Students with a European Baccalaureate (IB) who chose English as their language of instruction (language section with English as mother tongue or 1st foreign

The following students do not need to submit French language test results:



- Students whose native language is French and who want to study at Sciences Po in French
- Students whose language of instruction at their home university is French and who want to study at Sciences Po in French.
- Students who have a school leaving qualification from the French secondary school system (for example, from a lycée français in France or abroad).
- Students who have a higher education diploma from a university where the language of instruction is French.
- Students with an International Baccalaureate (IB) who chose French as their language of instruction (only at A1/A2 level).
- Students with a European Baccalaureate (IB) who chose French as their language
  of instruction (language section with French as mother tongue or 1st foreign
  language).
- Students who achieved a B2 or C1 of level of French at the Sciences Po Summer School.
- Students who hold an Abibac or Abitur mentioning their certified level of French, in line with the Franco-German agreement of 4 November 1988.

Exchange students exempt from language tests are required to submit the document justifying the exemption with their application: secondary school qualification, undergraduate qualification, proof of the language of instruction at the home institution, Sciences Po certificate.

# Please note the following information:

- 1. All exchange students must be nominated online by their home university (we do not accept nominations by email). Please respect our exchange agreement specificities, in particular with regards to campus and programme nomination. Should you need to discuss this, please don't hesitate to reach out.
- 2. You should only nominate students intending to study at Sciences Po in **January 2020 (Spring semester) for one or two semesters of study.** Students intending to take part in the exchange programme beginning in September 2020 can only be nominated online from April 2020.
- 3. The procedure for the nomination of your students and their application is scheduled from September 16th 2019 to October 10th 2019 at 04:00 pm (GMT+1) for an arrival in the Spring semester of the academic year 2019/2020.
- 4. Successfully nominated students will receive an email advising them **to complete and submit their application online and upload supporting documents** (there is no need to send hard copies by post).
- 5. Regarding the undergraduate exchange programme in Paris (if applicable), you must indicate in the nominating form whether your students must register in one or two specific disciplines mainly, it will inform teams for the preparation of the course registrations.
- 6. Regarding language tests provided by students, kindly note that for the bilingual programmes, the student self-evaluation is no longer possible.
- 7. Letters of acceptance will be sent directly to our partner universities from **October 21th 2019.**
